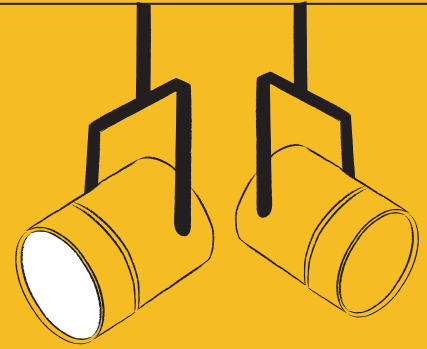

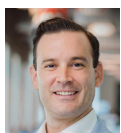

KEY CONSIDERATIONS

-  **Health Practice Commission registration:** All medical professionals must be registered or licensed with the HPC in accordance with local regulatory requirements.
-  **Work permits and residency:** Healthcare professionals require a work permit or permanent residency granted by Workforce Opportunities and Residency Cayman (WORC) to work in the Cayman Islands.
-  **Employment contracts:** Employment agreements must comply with local labour, pension and health insurance laws within clinical settings.
-  **Shareholder agreements:** Shareholder agreements can set out the rights and obligations of parties, supporting clear frameworks for dispute resolution.

-  **Trade and business licensing:** A Trade and Business Licence is required to establish a medical practice or clinic, and a Local Companies (Control) Licence may be needed in certain cases.
-  **Ongoing compliance:** Medical professionals and practices are subject to ongoing compliance requirements, including renewals and regulatory updates, to maintain good standing in the Cayman Islands.

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
